FALL TRAIL MIX CONCERT FRIDAY OCTOBER 13 THE WILDWOODS

Our great music man, Steve Ploum, has done it again bringing to the Preserve the band **Wildwoods**, so they ought to fit right in!

Our beautiful venue out in the east meadow by the east picnic pavilion will open up for concertgoers at 6 pm: Opening act (Donna Herula) starts at 7 pm, followed by our headliner **The Wildwoods.** This amazing trio has been described as "Harmonies that you can dip a spoon into". **The Wildwoods** are able to generate their own positive reviews from the likes of *Paste*



Magazine, Americana Highways, Foliking.com and All Music.com. We are pleased to introduce yet another very high caliber artist like **The Wildwoods** to our community, and thrilled that more and more people have expressed their confidence in Trail Mix to curate another amazing night out, right here in the tranquil surroundings of our Preserve.

We've sold-out two consecutive indoor concerts and the Aug 12th concert with Phoebe Hunt was the most well-attended Trail Mix Acoustic Concert Series concert to date. In addition, Trail Mix and the Preserve were thrilled to see how many people made an evening of it, gathering early for a drink under the twinkle lights in the East Pavilion, sat at candled tables, and together, created a sweet communal vibe, "like a mini Ravinia" some said.

As was the case on August 12, Izaak Walton volunteers will sell pizza, gourmet wrap sandwiches, water and soft drinks plus our new vendor, Cork Gaming and Wine Bar will provide beer/wine/cocktails.

So make sure you arrive right when the doors open at 6pm for the next outdoor Trail Mix concert on October 13th, with The Wildwoods, from Lincoln Nebraska. They are supporting their third album, *Foxfield St. John*, which features songs written while on their first European tour, and in addition to an impressive number of Spotify listeners, they boast music videos on Instagram that routinely hit north of 200k plays, and some have topped 6M plays. The opening act is also quite impressive: From Chicago, Slide and Delta Blues guitarist, singer/songwriter, Donna Herula, the 2022 winner of the Independent Blues Awards for "Best Traditional Blues Artist" and "Best Acoustic Blues Album." She will open with a set starting at 7pm on the 13th.

We have simplified the ticket sales for this concert. There are two tiers of tickets. The slightly more expensive tier assures a dry seat / warm seat should the weather be less than ideal; meaning that if we need to, we will move the stage under the pavilion if light rain. If heavier rain/chilly weather, the concert will be moved indoors at Senior Hall. All pre-purchased tickets will be less expensive than tickets purchased at the door. GENERAL MEETING—WORKING IN WATER, AN INTERNATIONAL VIEW THURSDAY OCTOBER 26TH—7 PM at SENIOR HALL

Protecting and managing global water supplies for people and the environment are perhaps the most important environmental challenges of the 21st Century. Human history is closely tied to both fresh and saltwater ecosystems; yet these systems have been abused and damaged for centuries by human activities.

We are very pleased to have one of our own, Dr. David J. Zaber, an environmental scientist and a member of our Board and Conservation Committee to present this program on this critical subject. Dave has worked for decades on ecological assessment, management and conservation with a focus on agriculture, environmental pollution and ecological restoration. Dave Zaber will be discussing his experiences in several African countries ¬- Angola, Ethiopia, Kenya and Tanzania - as an expert consultant with U.S. Agency for International Development's Farmer to Farmer program. Dae Zaber's work highlights global issues related to water use and conservation and the importance of global cooperation in solving environmental challenges.

Our General Meeting in September (9-20-23—see September Newsletter.) brought us a focus on Antarctica. So this October meeting we move our focus to Africa. What can we learn that is applicable to us from these far-away places? Come to the meeting and you will find out!

Once again, we are pleased to host The Homewood Science Center (HSC) which will be conducting their 7th annual Walk Walton event at the Preserve on Sunday Oct 22 from 10am until 1pm. This is a Nature Fest and fundraiser sponsored by the Weglarz Company for the benefit of HSC. This year's fest will feature the Illinois Natural History Survey's Traveling Exhibit, an insect petting zoo, Spooky science in Black Bear Lodge, learning about marine biology with UChicago's Professor Cathy Pfister, exploring nature with representatives of the Forest Preserves of Cook County, participating in a special project led by the Middle School Conservation Ecology interns plus a pumpkin patch and donuts & hot drinks. AUCTION: We will auction off items donated by members, typically household items, small tools, etc.as well as gift cards from local merchants. This year we will make best efforts to upgrade the auction and refrain from auctioning off unwanted junk.

PIZZA: Early arrivers can purchase pizza and soft drinks for sale after 6:15p. Table snacks and water will be provided free of charge.

Included with the ticket booklets is a letter describing this year's event. Individual raffle tickets will again cost \$5 or \$25 booklet of 6 tickets. Tickets may be donated to the needy if you wish; simply note that when returning ticket stubs and payment.
