WINTER FUNDRAISER MUSIC CONCERT*--THURSDAY FEB 20, 7:30PM

Returning again this year after their excellent inaugural concert last year, the local band "Work in Progress" will perform a concert in Senior Hall on Thursday February 20 to begin at 7:30p. Two 45 minutes sets are planned with one 15-minute break. There is no charge for this event but voluntary contributions to the Preserve will be accepted. Also, attendees will be allowed to bring their own alcoholic drinks to enjoy during the concert. In advance of the concert, at 6:45p, pizza from 5th Quarter as well as bottled water and pop will be available at reasonable prices. Free coffee, cider and snacks will be provided. This band has become well known locally having performed at numerous events including Homewood's Art and Garden Fair, Trail Mix at the Preserve, Homewood's Fall Festival, Grape and Grain, and One Trick Pony. Their music is best characterized as "Americana" which includes elements of bluegrass, newgrass, blues and rock and includes some original music. Instrumentation includes guitars, bass, banjo, mandolin, harmonica, and the cajon (a Peruvian percussion instrument). Musicians include Dirk French, Jeff Mahary, Steve and Steve Klein (father and son), Rob Mayes, and Tim Majkowski. Music will be performed without amplification due to the wonderful acoustics in the cabin. THINK SPRING: NATIVE PLANT SALE AT HWIP

Again this spring, HIWP will co-sponsor a native plant sale with Thorn Creek Audubon Society (TCAS). This year, thirty-four different plants will be offered at the sale, including trees, shrubs, flowers, and ornamental grasses. Plants are chosen to represent different colors, textures, sun exposures and bloom times. All are native to this area of Illinois. Judy Johnson, a member of both organizations and plant sale organizer, stresses that native plants are beneficial to wildlife and the environment. Local wildlife, including pollinators, depend on native plants for food and shelter. Also, native plants thrive without pesticides or fertilizers and, once established, do not require watering. The very deep root systems also help prevent erosion and flooding. In order to better ensure that you obtain the plants you desire, **we strongly encourage pre-ordering** as the supply of plants not preordered will be limited. The order form can be accessed on our website; just print it out and follow directions. Order forms are also available in the office which is

staffed on Saturday mornings during the winter. **Deadline to pre-order is March 1. Plant delivery and open sale is Saturday, May 23 from 9-noon at HIWP.** All profits will be split between HIWP and TCAS. WATER QUALITY TESTING AND LAKE REPORT

We recently hired a company (Environmental Aquatic Management LLC) to analyze the quality of the water in the Sandpit Lakes. We last performed these tests of the Sandpit Lakes in 2003. These tests are extensive measuring 15 parameters including dissolved oxygen, hardness and several other chemical and bacteria measurements. Sediment depth is also checked. We are gratified to report that the Sandpit lakes are very healthy and provide an excellent habitat for fish and other aquatic creatures. In fact, the company reports that the overall health of these lakes is among the top 10% of all the lakes that they have analyzed over many years. Who knew? And no dredging is recommended or advantageous in any way. We have made the entire report available on our website. This is the first "capital project" funded by the proceeds of our sale of 2.6 acres to CN back in early 2019. Our thanks to board members Tony Talarico and Carolyn Bury for their assistance in obtaining and understanding this report.

YOUTH FISHING CLUB FORMING
